We often take for granted the many freedoms we enjoy as Americans because of veterans. The sacrifices our veterans have made on behalf of this great state and nation stand as examples that underscore the need for us to take our responsibilities seriously, especially our right to vote. Across the nation, statistics show youth voter participation declined dramatically through the 90's and into this millennium. But presidential elections in 2004, 2008 and 2012 showed a slight increase in turnout among younger voters. Our hope is that we can build on this encouraging trend.

To this goal, the Pinellas County Supervisor of Elections office developed its Vote in Honor of a Vet program, which is presented annually in area high schools. The intent of this program is to encourage voter participation among our senior high school voting-age population, as well as teach them about the sacrifices our veterans have made so that we may continue to live in a democratic society. By exercising our right to vote, we show veterans the respect they deserve for protecting our representative democracy.

This is how the program works. Veterans complete and submit a short biography on a Vote in Honor of a Vet Veteran Biography Form. The form may be completed by veterans or by family members of deceased veterans or those missing in action. Certificates with veterans' biographies will be presented as part of a Voter Registration Drive to high school seniors. After students register to vote they are encouraged to Vote in Honor of Their Vet. Our hope is to personalize the voting experience for high school students by helping them understand the relationship between the sacrifices of our veterans and their right to vote.

We need your participation to make this valuable program a success. You may make copies of the Veteran Biography Form and distribute them as you wish. Completed forms should be returned to the address at the bottom of the form. If you should have any questions, contact the Voter Outreach Department at (727) 464-5700.

# Restaurant/Bar Restrictions !!! IMPORTANT !!!

We must have more food sales than alcohol sales to keep the bar open. Our solution is:

With a food purchase, alcoholic drinks may be sold and served to any customer of age.

Post 7 Members who present a valid Post 7 Member ID Card may be served alcoholic beverages without a food purchase. Their guests and/or family may not purchase drinks without a food purchase unless they have their own valid Post 7 member ID card.

Only Post 7 ID cards for The Legion, the S.A.L. or the Auxiliary are acceptable.

If you want to become a member of Post 7, see the article above this one, and/or contact a post officer for an application, or see our web site for an application.

Under no circumstances, will anyone be permitted to bring alcoholic beverages purchased somewhere other than at Post 7. Anyone doing so will not be permitted in the building and/or will be asked to leave. Repeat offenders may be banned from the post.

The Post 7 bartenders and waitresses have the right and duty to refuse to serve alcoholic beverages to any person they believe to be underaged or dangerously intoxicated.

A \$50.00 contribution fills one bag for school aged children. The bags are filled with but not limited to one pair of shoes, socks, underwear, shirts, slacks etc. All items are NEW and are purchased by the charity. We gave them a check for \$150.00 which will fulfill 3 children's dreams for much needed items. Because the items are purchased by the organization only monetary gifts are accepted.

Those of you who have enjoyed GOT IT games in the past may be disappointed to learn that our attendance has been less than sufficient to support the games in the future. The auxiliary has been the beneficiary of these games but the amount of profit we make cannot support the Bartender nor a cook.

alcoholic beverage I will again address this with our Commander Bob, to see if we can make a compromise that will be satisfactory to both post 7 and unit 7. The GOT IT game as it stands now CANNOT support a bartender nor will it ever support the salary of a bartender with the limited participants we have had over the past couple of years.
